

#### History of FUSIT now available!

The book *A Liberal Church* is the illustrated history of the First Unitarian Society of Ithaca from 1865 to 1945. It was written by Carol Kammen, the Tompkins County Historian, and aided greatly by FUSIT member Beverly Henderson West. Read about being a liberal congregation in the midst of orthodoxy, and wonder how and why FUSIT was planted in Ithaca and how it grew.

This book began on the occasion of our 150th anniversary, when Mark Pedersen asked our Ithaca historian Carol Kammen if she could write a book on the history of our church. A meeting was called for those interested in the project, committees were formed, and we proceeded on several fronts. After many delays, not the least of which was caused by the pandemic, the book was finally printed last summer.

The book is now available for a \$15 donation in the parlor after services or in the church office anytime the office is open.

### Your Board Has Been Busy! John Gaines

You may be familiar with the more formal aspects of the work of your Board of Trustees this year. The Board regularly publishes meeting agendas, meeting minutes, committee and ministry team reports, Sense of the Meeting reports, Board member articles in the Weekly Announce and Connections, the Annual Report, Open Questions, and letters to the congregation. We have also held occasional Congregational Conversations. And recently the Board has created the Ministry Fulfillment Committee and the Ministry Visioning Team and the Operations Administrative Team. That is all well and good, but what else has been happening this past year that you may not have heard about?

There are three behind-the-scenes activities that have not been in the spotlight. Firstly, a planning retreat was held last June before the new church year even got started. Given Covid restrictions we met at Cass Park for a full round of discussions on how we would get the year started on the right foot. That session helped set the tone for much of our work.

Secondly, we established a Slack Workspace for sharing internal communications and work products. When a new topic would emerge we would set up a new Slack channel so that posts dedicated to that topic could be shared without having to sort thought volumes of email searching for the, "I know I read that somewhere" nugget. There are twenty-three Slack channels now.

And lastly, thanks to the expansive view that Fred Balfour has brought to the leadership development responsibilities of the Nominating Committee, your Board has been engaged with both extensive on-boarding and training during the year. Sample topics include UUA strategic thinking modules and legal aspects of serving on a church board. We all owe a debt to Fred for his persistence and creativity in helping us to be better board members.

I hope that this helps round out your picture of what your Board has been doing this year. As always, we are indebted to the church staff and many volunteers who have stepped up to keep the committees and ministry teams thriving this year. Thank you!
