

The Board met in retreat with these two teams to begin developing collaborative relationships, communication patterns, and boundaries for our separate responsibilities.

The Board is also excited about the possibilities with spiritual leadership coming from a triad of local women with years of experience: Emily Richard, Director of Congregational Life; Peaches Gillette, Associate Director of Congregational Life; and Janet Shortall, Pastoral Care.

Welcome Peaches Gillette!

Beginning **September 1st**, we are very pleased to announce that Peaches Gillette will join the FUSIT staff as our new Associate Director of Congregational Life.

Peaches has been an educator for more than 45 years in both the private and public school setting and has structured literacy programs for two non-profit organizations including Brooklyn's Juvenile Detention Center. Presently, she substitutes for the Ithaca School District and the Newfield School District.

She taught language arts and poetry for College Initiative Upstate, a program that works to create educational pathways for individuals whose lives have been curtailed by court-involvement or a history of incarceration.

Peaches is an ordained chaplain. She has had the opportunity to work with battered women, the mentally disabled and veterans. She maintains an active chaplain relationship with individuals in Bedford Correctional Facility, Albion Correctional Facility and Attica Prison. Peaches is also a Spiritual Counselor and Race-Relations Specialist and a published poet.

Peaches sits on the Tompkins County Human Rights Commision and in the past, has served as a Tri-chair of the Eastern Southern Tier of the Poor People's Campaign. She presently sits on the Dryden School Board.

Although formally educated at Empire State College for her BS in Education and at Fordham University for her MS in Pastoral Care and Counseling, where she was nominated for a Fulbright, Peaches's compassion developed by experiencing the harshness of racism she faced as a child and by being raised by a mother who did not allow the harshness of being Black in America diminish her sense of peace, her love of others or her faith.

Operations Administration Team (OAT)

This newly formed team will work to oversee the administration of the church operations and serve as governance partners with the Board to manage operations. It will serve as a supervisor to the paid staff members and review their work annually. It will also be responsible for recommending the hiring and firing of paid staff members, should the need arise. It will also oversee spending and make budget recommendations.

Charge:

- -Guide and coordinate the work of the paid staff
- -Coordinate searches for new staff members
- -Recommend hiring and firing of staff members to the Board
- -Provide input to annual budgets and compensation recommendations for salary and benefits made in consultation with Finance and Personnel Committees
- -Evaluate the paid staff's work, and report those reviews to the Board at least annually
- -Provide a monthly written report to the Board summarizing staff activities and the Organization and Operation Team's focus areas
- -Create intentional communication with the Ministry Visioning Team

Term of Service: 2 years, with 1 possible reappointment. After the first year of implementation, members will rotate off in alternate years to ensure a degree of continuity from year to year. Contact: oat@uuithaca.org

Way Forward Team Guidance for Continued Re-opening September 1, 2022

We are excited to welcome members of our congregation back into our sanctuary for Worship Services as well as our many other programs for this church year.

Following the current guidelines set forth by the CDC and local health department, masking will be optional but is still highly encouraged for all FUSIT events with the following exceptions:

- All attendees of Sunday morning worship services will be required to wear a mask and a section will be reserved for continued physical distancing. Speakers will continue to take a rapid test before services.
- Masks will be required at all Choir rehearsals and performances or any time that extended group singing occurs.
- As a covenantal community we encourage all groups to have open and compassionate discussions about the needs of all participants in regards to mask use.
- We request that anyone who develops symptoms of COVID within 48 hours of attending any in-person programming at FUSIT, please get tested as soon as possible and if positive, contact the office so that other individuals who were present can be informed of possible exposure. Or, if you test positive within 48 hours without symptoms, also please contact the office.

*If at any point the Tompkins County Health Department moves to a mask requirement or mandate, or local infection levels warrant it, all FUSIT events will return to mandatory masking.

If the answer to any of the below three questions is yes we ask that you please refrain from using the building for any reason and follow these CDC guidelines.

- I. Have you had any COVID-19 symptoms in the past 14 days, including fever/chills, cough, shortness of breath, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell?
- 2. Have you had a positive COVID-19 diagnostic test in the past 14 days?
- 3. Have you had close contact with a confirmed or suspected COVID-19 case in the past 14 days?

Closing Policy
