This project hopes to help foster the telling of these stories through publishing what we hear on Sundays, both the full sermons and the shorter talks, such as, the occasional "Matters of Our Lives" section of our service. I believe our working theology is constantly being defined by the sum total of all our specific and personal thoughts, beliefs, experiences, and actions in so far as they support our stated UU Principles. UUism thrives on personal experiences promoting spiritual growth. Through our stories, we collectively define the church.

To this end, I am compiling an accessible text archive of such sermons and talks formally delivered to the congregation, occasionally dipping back into the deeper past, but primarily starting with last summer's wide-ranging sermons.
