Then we can truly create a place where all belong, a place where we can do the work of living our shared values through the discipline of Love.

# **Greetings from Religious Exploration**

Welcome to a new year of Religious Exploration (RE).

This year Soul Matters offers us an "overarching frame in The Practices of Our Faith. We're using this frame to focus on how Unitarian Universalism is a lived faith that inspires us to act, live, and love our values out in the world. Or, to put it another way, we're diving into our long-loved commitment to "deeds, not creeds." Our frame of practices is also a way for us to connect to our <u>UUA's</u> new core value of love, with each of our monthly themes being framed as a practice that helps us embody love in our daily lives."

We are thrilled to continue to offer Religious Exploration programming three Sundays a month, with two Classroom Sundays, and one mixed ages Creative Sunday. This programming will help us to continue to meet the needs of our children and youth by offering lessons and activities that are more precisely geared toward each age group.

Our PreK-1st and 2nd-5th classrooms will be focusing on our monthly themes, starting with Invitation, through stories, activities, crafts, and games. 

September's Shared Plate offering will be donated to the Village at Ithaca. Village at Ithaca advocates for educational equity and excellence for all students, particularly Black/ African American, Hispanic/Latino/Latinx, low income, and any other underserved students within Tompkins County through strategic community relationships, assessment of the local district's practices and policies, and responsive programs and services. The ongoing partnership between FUSIT and the Village at Ithaca has supported families in our community in countless ways, from serving 30 families weekly with free food and household goods to hosting beautiful student-led social justice art to supporting unstably housed youth and families as they settled into permanent housing.

# 8th Principle Action Ministry

The 8th Principle Action Ministry (8PAM) began meeting via Zoom on the fourth Wednesday of the month starting on August 28th at 7:00 pm. We will have a special speaker joining us for the meeting. Beth Murray, Administrator for Worthy Now Ministry, a UU-related organization, will be describing a letter-writing program to people in prison. Beth will answer questions for those interested in volunteering to write letters. Currently, there is a waiting list of over 100 people who would like to correspond with someone "outside". The 8PAM team has met several times over the summer as a Democracy Circle, continuing the postcard writing effort organized by Nick Garin. We also explored ways to mobilize disenfranchised voters for the November election by connecting with various UU groups and national organizations. The Democracy Circle will continue to meet in the Fall after Sunday service starting on **September 15** at noon. Look for an announcement as to the location.

On **September 1st** bethany ojalehto mays and friends will be speaking at the morning service in the Parlor, bringing us news of the group Cornell On Fire which works to push the university to do better work on issues of social and environmental justice.

Are you interested in how intergenerational conversations can contribute to building a sustainable community? On **September 8th**, local <u>Sunrise Ithaca</u> organizer, Ace Dufresne, will be with us at noon in the Annex. Don't know what the Sunrise Ithaca organization does? Ace will explain. Climate justice issues, the Ithaca Green New Deal, crossing the generational divide all will be touched on and Ace will also have resources to help attendees get involved. Work on converting the fossil fuel powered heating system in the Annex to electric heat pumps continues. Almost all of the inside work has been completed. The contractor, Simply Installs, worked above and beyond a normal workday schedule and, when converting the ground floor spaces, did a good job of minimizing disruption to the pre-school's programs and operations. Now we're waiting for a crane to remove the outdated, existing (and very very heavy) HVAC equipment from the roof, and to raise the new compressors for the Air Source Heat Pumps onto the roof, out of sight and hearing. When complete, we will not only have equipment sized properly for the current uses of that building, but we will have also eliminated, in that building, the direct use of fossil fuels.

Celebrate Bisexuality Day is observed annually to recognize and celebrate bisexual people, the bisexual community, and the history of bisexuality.



After a democratic process involving thousands of Unitarian Universalists discussing the faith's values and core theology over the past three-plus years, delegates at General Assembly 2024 voted decisively to approve a new <u>statement of values</u> and beliefs for <u>Unitarian Universalism</u>, which places love at the center of this faith.

# Blast from the Board **Acronym Anxiety**

Earlier this month, I was eating lunch with one of our Team Leaders. He is an ex-Board member and has been around for over a decade. I mentioned working with OAT and MVT.

"I'm confused by the new acronyms," he said.

"I've heard that comment more than once." I said. In fact, younger members tell me a couple of things.

-One is that the church acronyms are confusing and mystifying.

-Second, the acronyms seem a special language used by insiders and old-timers. It feels like FUSIT is a bunch of closed groups.

Two years ago, our Communications Committee (no mystery with this name) noted that the monthly reports were "acronym rich" and were confusing to read, even for Board members. The committee developed the following footnote for Monthly Reports Template.

Stewardship Consultant, Lydia Ferrante-Roseberry, will be with us the weekend of October 4th. She will meet with our board and staff on Friday, and our members and friends on Saturday morning to hear about our culture, concerns, and our hopes and priorities for the congregation. Saturday afternoon, she'll be conducting a special workshop on Stewardship. A core focus of the visit will be on identifying recommended next steps and practical information to help us successfully pursue our mission. In particular, FUSIT has been growing since we came out of the pandemic, but volunteerism seems to be reflecting pandemic legacy effects. With Stewardship, our main source of operating revenue, the congregation fully emerged from our pandemic low and leaned into the 'Gifting Grows Connections' theme to reach our target. Nonetheless, our target was modest relative to what would propel our mission, and our age distribution and pledge size distribution generate future vulnerabilities that need to be planned for.

On Sunday after the service Lydia will present her initial observations and recommendations to our entire congregation. A follow-up meeting and report will be delivered within two weeks of the visit.
