# Our Spiritual Tourney

It was 14 years ago in January when someone asked if I would be interested in auditioning for the organist gig that had just opened up at the First Unitarian Society of Ithaca. This job for the Unitarians was technically for just over 3 months - February through the first week of June - and I could agree to that. I had never played for a Unitarian Universalist church before, but I had a friend in college who was always trying to convince me that this would be my place. Plus, one look at the Helmuth Wolff mechanical action organ, a sibling to the organ in the Chapel at Anabel Taylor Hall where I had fallen in love with this type of design, clinched the deal.

Somehow, that dissertation got successfully defended (Iron Deficiency Anemia and Child Behavior in Senegal) and baby #3 was about to join the family. My dreams of returning to Senegal more permanently were pushed aside. I would try to find work on local nutrition issues and these UUs were starting to grow on me. Mostly, it was Mark Pedersen, the long-time congregational administrator and underground minister-without-a-degree who counseled everyone who came into his office and lived his UU values with his every action. He was an employee but also a member, volunteering in the classrooms and organizing events outside of his job description. This was just the sort of church colleague I needed and despite the ups and downs of ministers-interim minister-no ministers-back to a called minister, he was the rock that kept our ship afloat. I have missed him every day since his sudden death in 2018.

And now, after 14 years of music ministry to this congregation, I am ready to step down. There are projects that have been left unfinished in my life that I need to get back to, and already new projects are beckoning for my involvement. I saw my role as Music Director at First Unitarian as a way to comfort the activists in our community, giving respite and inspiration so they could continue the work you are called to do. Now, I am taking back the 25-30 hours a week that I devote to this place to find other ways to serve my wider community. Thank you for your love and support through all of these years. (And no worries, I will be staying on through the beginning of June! Hopefully, a new musician will be hired by the time September comes around.)



## April Side With Love and Shared Plate – Village at Ithaca

The Tuesday Evening Small Group has selected Village House, a project of the Village at Ithaca, for our April Side With Love and Shared Plate. Village House is a large duplex in the city which provides safe, supportive housing for homeless youth or youth ages 18 to 25 escaping abusive living situations. Most youth arrive at Village House with little more than the clothes on their backs. To help them we will be collecting: toothpaste, toothbrushes, toilet paper, and laundry detergent.

Original funding for this most worthwhile effort ended last fall. Village House was able to operate through December on private donations, and now the Tompkins County Legislature has approved the use of some Rescue Plan Funds to continue operations until some grant applications are funded. However, in this interim period dollars are needed for wraparound services such as personnel costs, food and supplies.

# From the Board of Trustees

There can be no doubt that some of the work of the Board of Trustees is tedious. Especially when viewed from the outside, it may seem as if what the board does is crosses i's and dots t's with little effect. More generously, board members may feel that this work is mundane, but necessary. Assuring that someone has the authority to disburse or collect funds, for example, is hardly a flashy activity, but without this sort of work, the Society would soon find itself unable to do the visible things that are more interesting and allow us to pursue our vision.

However, this two-dimensional view of the board leaves out the good stuff. Sometimes the board plays a role in helping the various parts of the congregation work together well. Recently, board members joined others in putting together a celebration of Walt Peck's recent encore tenure as Treasurer. Once, Walt joked he would never realize his dream of owning a Porsche Carrera by volunteering at the church. Board member Renee Rogers proved him wrong by presenting him (a scale-model) Porsche in recognition of his dedication and perseverance.

The Board has been working with the Stewardship Committee this year, helping to find the means to bring church finance expert Rev. Lydia Ferrante-Roseberry to Ithaca to help the entire community understand our attitudes about money and to begin to build a more robust stewardship process at FUSIT. This bringing together of all the elements of the Society that are concerned with our fiscal well-being has been a great exercise in partnerships, cooperation, and building on our strengths. Although it is reasonable to expect it to take a number of years to see Rev. Lydia's ideas come to fruition, we are already experiencing an energized stewardship campaign this spring.

The board is also continuing to learn the power of partnership, extending the lines of communication and collaboration with the ministry team and the administration team. Shared leadership is less a concept on paper and increasingly a powerful way to get things done

Being present to celebrate the successes of a longtime volunteer, being able to help kindle new ideas about money and fund-raising, seeing the continued evolution of the governance model are a fry cry from the slogging through the policy book, but they make being a board member a dynamic experience.


# **Automatic Door Opener**

-The automatic door opener on the garden entrance is now installed allowing easier access for people who use wheel-chairs or could just use a little assistance opening the door. This will work when the doors are unlocked (for Sunday morning service and other events).

This is made possible by using the funds collected when our beloved Administrator, Mark Pedersen, died unexpectedly in 2018. The decision to use the funds in this manner was made in collaboration with his husband, Rod Howe. Rod feels that Mark would appreciate the funds being used in this way, allowing better access to the FUSIT building that he cared so deeply for. We are grateful for this addition and are grateful for all that Mark contributed to the church and its members during his time here.

#### **Exiting**

- You will always be able to exit the building, even if the doors are locked. There is a motion detector that will unlock the door so you can exit and there is a red exit button near each door in case there is an issue with the motion detector.
