# Our Spiritual Tourney

There is an ancient Jewish prayer called the "Modeh Ani" or "I Thank" prayer that is intended to be the very first action that a person takes upon waking each morning. The ancient words are mostly commonly translated as:

I give thanks before you, God living and eternal, for You have returned within me my soul with compassion; abundant is Your faithfulness.

In English we translate the prayer as starting with word I, I give thanks. And yet the first word of the prayer isn't אני אחול Ani, which is the word for I, it's מודה Modeh, which means thanks or thank you. Modeh is best understood as a human emotion that doesn't have a direct translation into English and it means not simply to give thanks, or feel thankful, but also to admit or surrender. And I wondered at first what these three words, that in English have such different meanings, had in common. As I sat in contemplation turning these words over in my mind it came to me that there is a sense of humility in each of these feelings. The feeling of being thankful, of admitting, of surrendering, each require an acknowledgement in some way of something greater than ourselves.

And it is worth noting again that in the original Hebrew the first word of the prayer is not Ani, or I, but Modeh, meaning thanks. So the intention of this prayer is that the first word to pass your lips each day, the first sound that you make upon waking, is gratitude.

As Unitarian Universalists we lift up the wisdom that is found in all religions and hold pluralism as one of the core values of this faith. This month as we Nurture Gratitude within ourselves and the world around us, we may draw from the wisdom of the Jewish tradition and greet each day with gratitude and thanks, opening up with humility to the spirit of love and life, that eternal presence that holds us with compassion and care.

May it be so.



# Message from the Board of Trustees - How Does FUSIT "Work"?

**Are you curious about how our Society "works"?** How we keep the lights on and the building clean? How we pay the staff and raise the money to pay our bills? How we interact with the city of Ithaca and the state of New York? If you answer, "Yes, I am curious" then read on. If you answer, "Nope sounds boring", then move on to the other articles in this wonderful monthly newsletter: "Ithaca UU Connections". If you are still reading then ...

Think of FUSIT as two organizations. We are, first and foremost, a faith-based organization. We are members of organizations such as: 1) The Unitarian Universalist Association Inc; and 2) ACT (Area Churches Together). Secondly, we are a nonprofit organization, subject to state laws such as: 1) "Consolidated Laws of New York; Chapter 51; Article 19: Unitarian and Universalist Societies"; and 2) "New York Consolidated Laws; Not-For-Profit Corporation Law - NPC § 552. Standard of conduct in managing and investing an institutional fund." Sound a bit complex? Yep, it can be, but we have developed ...

**Partnership Governance to organize ourselves.** As a faith-based organization, we created the Ministry Visioning Team (MVT) to guide and coordinate the work of the ministry. And we created the Operations Administrative Team (OAT) to guide and make independent decisions regarding the administration of the church operations. Both Teams partner with the Board whose role is planning, setting goals, monitoring church programs and activities.

What has our nonprofit side done lately to make our Society "work", or work better? A major accomplishment is the implementation of consistent staff job descriptions and related compensation. Our hard-working Personnel Committee used UUA-provided templates to tailor a system that works with a Society of our size and structure. Another accomplishment is applying for the legal status of a 501C3. That status is often required when applying for grants or to allow an employer to match a congregant's donation to FUSIT. We've accomplished a number of other things over the past two years, and you might ask...

**"Do I need to think about this nonprofit side of our Society?"** Basically, NO. You can rest assured that the Board, MVT, and OAT are doing the nonprofit stuff that allows us to focus on our primary task of being our best as a faith-based organization. BUT, if you are interested in what and how we are accomplishing the nonprofit stuff then look up the monthly Board minutes on the website. You will find the improved Board minutes that now has a Table of Contents which allows you to quickly find the discussions and motions that interest you. But wait, there's more! YOU just might be one of our members who would like to help with our nonprofit activities by volunteering for one of the partnership teams or the Board. If you are that person, don't delay! # FUSIT Finances #6 New budgeting and spending paradigm

The savings mentioned in previous reports are sourced from previous years when revenues exceeded expenses. These savings have for years provided a cushion when things happen in pledger's lives that impact their ability to make their commitment. And those savings funds provided our programming with some wiggle room when special opportunities arose.

For this fiscal year, we will all need to adjust our perception of church finances. Whenever possible, pledges need to be completed; and the earlier the better. Seeking and creating opportunities for new revenue sources like building space rentals and fundraisers should be on our minds. And let's brainstorm fund raisers that involve the greater Ithaca community. Similarly, supporting church programming with your time and energy reduces program costs.

The Operations Administrative Team has nearly completed a 501c3 application for our church, which, when granted, allows many opportunities for grant applications to be submitted. And 501c3 designation provides a pathway for matching gift employers to match your gift to FUSIT.

What is love calling you to do? The world needs Unitarian Universalists to show up for justice with spiritual grounding, generosity, humility, courage, and concrete skills. It is a spiritual practice to choose love over fear, to be brave, to show up when we're called, to occupy space with loving resistance rather than fearful retreat. We are most powerful when we understand that all the issues we care most deeply about are fundamentally interlinked, and that each of us has a role to play in building a world in which all people can be free and thrive.
