On behalf of the RE Team, I want to take a moment to thank everyone once again who joined us as volunteers in the RE Children's Education Program in 2016-2017. It has been a vibrant and active year in RE, and the RE Team is busily planning, looking forward to an exciting RE Year in 2017-18 here at FUSIT! We have many exciting plans for this coming year, including expanded curriculum, now out for you to see, for preschool and elementary aged children, as well as a broad set of offerings and experiences for middle and high school youth, as well as adults! We look forward to gathering a fantastic group of volunteer teachers for this year's RE programs, and we are really excited!

One of the most exciting pieces of news is that we have picked solid dates for the Intergenerational Service Learning trip to Guatemala!! The trip will be our first FUSIT RE Service Learning trip, and is open to adults and parent accompanied youth 14+. High School Youth Service Learning Program participants in 11th and 12th grade are welcome to apply to travel with the group, chaperoned by RE Program Staff. Service at San Lucas Mission is focused on creating relationships through communal work on projects empowering local communities, and supporting economic and environmental sustainability. Contact the FUSIT DRE's office to learn more about this great intergenerational initiative, including fund-raising opportunities for youth, via sales of delicious, fair-trade Juan Ana coffee! Some brief details:

WHERE? - San Lucas Toliman, Guatemala in the mountains 68 miles west Guatemala City, in the Lake Atitlan region. It is a Mayan area known for its remarkable natural beauty.

WHEN? - Approximately Saturday to Saturday, FEBRUARY 18th to 25th, 2018. In country travel will be arranged by the Mission. COST: around \$1200 total - airfare, food and lodging.

WHAT? - Service at the Mission focused on building relationships through working together on various projects and at the coffee factory, empowering local community, and creating a sustainable economy for the people of the area. (Youth fundraising opportunities available).

WHO? - An intergenerational group of adults and youth from FUSIT and other local congregations. Members of our FUSIT community have participated previously.



Help Needed to Provide Lunches for Friendship Center in July and August

We need four volunteers to each make and deliver 15 bag lunches to the Friendship Center on Tuesday, **July 4** and on Tuesday, **August 1**. Volunteers may be individuals, families, or groups of any kind. You buy supplies, make the lunches at home, or where you choose, no more than 24 hours before delivery, and deliver them between 9:30 and 11:30 am to 618 W. State Street.

Lunches must contain a sandwich, a piece of soft fruit (no apples) and a cookie or other small dessert and should be substantial since the recipients may not get another full meal that day. All foods should be easy to chew. The center asks that we make a simple list of the foods on the outside of the bag, so its staff can accomomodate preferences and allergies.

Your expenses can be reimbursed by the Social Justice Council: just keep track of what you spend and contact Martha Ferger at marthaferger068@gmail.com.

The Friendship Center is a drop-in assistance center for Ithacans who are homeless or otherwise in need, run by the Rescue Mission Alliance of Syracuse. It provides assistance in landlord-tenant disputes, locating housing and obtaining social benefits, and free bag lunches twice a week.
