As many of you know, our worship services for the last few years have been theme-based. Each month, we use a Soul Matters program theme, and we consider the question "What does it mean to be a people of..." In 2019, we've explored integrity, faith, and resilience. Reverend Margaret's sermons for the month, the readings, music, and even the work of the Aesthetics Team align with the theme. In addition, most of our small groups explore the themes in more depth during their meetings.

This month the theme is revelation, and our religious exploration program will focus on the theme too! Our children and youth will learn about Passover, Easter, and diversity. April is the perfect time to see what will be revealed in nature and within ourselves.

We hope the experience adults have in our sanctuary on Sunday can compliment what our children learn in religious exploration. It's my hope that by exploring the theme of revelation in RE, we can take our faith with us when we leave on Sundays and continue the dialogue throughout the week about what it means to be a people of revelation.



(The process is complicated, but the young people probably would not live with the guardian, but would stay working on the farm). 

We were all heartbroken when our beloved Mark Pedersen passed away unexpectedly Sept. 16. Over 35 folks have contributed to a fund in his name, which now has over \$5,000.

We are pleased to announce plans to use this money. First, we will use a portion of it to buy a new phone system for the church. This is may not seem very exciting, but Mark desperately wanted to replace our clumsy system. A little of the money will be used to support the "Mark Rides On" team participating in the STAP AIDS Ride for Life this September.

The largest portion will be used to help defray costs of members attending the UUA General Assembly which occurs in June each year. Mark attended for many years and wanted to see more of our congregation attend. We are finalizing guidelines for applying for up to \$500 of support to attend GA in person or cover costs of remote online participation. This funding should be available for several years.
