Fom Susanne Quagliata, Acting Director of Religious Exploration

My focus during this year of transition has been on our children, the curriculum, and communication. Included below are some reflections from this year organized around the "3Cs." Children: We began the year with 50 children and youth registered in our program and have expanded to 75. The average attendance on Classroom Sundays was 30. One of my favorite moments each week is our Time for Wonder; it's such a joy to see so many UU children and youth with us on Sunday mornings.

Curriculum: We use age-appropriate curriculum across our five different classrooms. The resources we have acquired include many different activities, games, stories, and material lists. Reviewing, selecting, and preparing the curriculum and acquiring and organizing supplies and materials each week can take a lot of my time. Our mid-year survey found that 95% of respondents strongly agree or agreed that current RE programming meets the needs of their children/youth.

Communication: In addition to my monthly updates here, I've provided a message in every mid-week announcement this year, sent weekly updates to parents, and maintained regular communication with over 40 volunteer teachers, assistant teachers, and substitute teachers. As a result, our survey found 90% of parents and guardians were very satisfied with the communication they received about Religious Exploration at FUSIT.

I am proud of what our Religious Exploration program has done this year. While I've done my best to share mostly facts, I'd like to take a moment to share my feelings. The FUSIT staff has been supportive and wonderful to work with. I am grateful to have had them by my side this year. The volunteers in the RE program have made everything that we accomplished this year possible. They have provided a loving and warm experience for our children and I can't thank them enough. It has been a joy getting to know all of our young UUs. I feel hopeful for our future after seeing the amazing hearts and minds that make up our program.


