Dear FUSIT Members and Friends,

<u>Per the guidance of the UUA</u>, we are canceling all gatherings, including in-person worship on Sunday, effective immediately.

This is the kind of response we now need here to flatten the curve of infection, which means to avoid an exponential growth and peak of illnesses that will immediately outstrip the hospital beds, dedicated staff, and ventilators available in our community and beyond.

Here is what we need to do: Stay home. Stop everything. Cancel the music concert, postpone the dinner party, don't go to the play. Yes, I mean you. Yes, I mean the thing that you have been looking forward to for quite some time. Yes, I understand that you are heartbroken. I am, too.

What experts are currently encouraging, as incredible and hard as it sounds, is isolation from community life as we all know it. Just for a time. So we can give our nurses, doctors, techs, and hospitals a fighting chance. So that every older or vulnerable person (which means most of you, let's be honest, and if it doesn't mean you, it means your parents and grandparents and friends) has a greater possibility of making it through this. So that, when we finally come back together, there are not empty spaces at our table and in our pews.

My people. My congregation. Community with whom I have agreed to walk together in these years. I love you more than you know. Yes, really and truly. Yes, even you. Especially you. You with your brave, broken heart. You with your many hopes.

This is indeed an emergency. It is a risk to many you love. The need for social distancing is immediate and dire.

Get home. Stay home. If not for you, then for those in your life that you could be unknowingly exposing.

And let us know what you need.

Here are four simple ways that we can all do this.

- I **Be a helper.** There are always helpers, even in troubling times. Why not be one. Call someone every day. Check in via text. Connect on FaceTime. It might be our inclination to focus on our fears, but if we look for ways to help it will elevate our optimism.
- 2 **Stay calm and focused.** Take things one step at a time. And if you can, take those steps outside and appreciate your surroundings. Breathe deeply, sing and dance, talk to a calm friend on the phone.
- 3 **Show gratitude.** Say thank you to the people working hard to keep us all safe. Doctors who are treating the sick, school leaders who made the decision to close so we can slow the spread of the virus, store clerks who continue to show up so we can restock on necessities.
- 4 **Show compassion and recognize our humanity.** It is likely that we will go through periods of fear, frustration, even anger. Be kind to yourself, your family, and all others during this time.

We are on this journey together, this new uncertain journey. Let's all lean in, way in, to our UU values. I will continue to share resources in my weekly email to families. Please reach out to me directly if there is any way I can support you and your family.

For example, type in "\$25 Spark" to the number above and you will give \$25 to the 20-21 Stewardship campaign.

Just think what magic we can create in the coming year when all of us pledge with love. Pledges at all levels are welcome and needed. Our resources vary, but each contribution is important.

You can pay your pledge weekly, monthly, or all at once. The fiscal year runs from July 1 to June 30, so you have until the end of June 2021 to complete your pledge, but it is important to make it now. The Board of Trustees is already working on the budget that will be voted on at the annual meeting in May.

How much First Unitarian can plan to do depends on how much income there will be. Our annual giving, that we are pledging this month, accounts for 75 percent of First Unitarian's income.


