You have been on my mind and heart these past weeks as we practice social distancing and sheltering in place. I have been uplifted to see the ways you are showing up for one another: engaging in small groups, attending worship and coffee hour online, and grocery shoppiing for those who need it, and offering meals to those who need them. What a blessing it is that we have one another and this vital religious community during such a trying time.

Our safety team and staff at FUSIT has been meeting, gathering resources and discerning how, when, and in what manners we might consider re-opening our building and resuming in-person programming. As you know, information and guidance from health agencies and the powers that be is evershifting and changing.

Most recently, guidance has coe out from our Unitarian Universalist Association. I've attached the communication from our UUA President, Rev. Susan Frederick-Gray, to this message. The essence is that, given the current outlook, the UUA is recommending that we prepare not to resume in-person programming until May 2021.

Yes, I know. Yes, a year. I know-it's a lot to consider.

And I know that this guidance was not offered without deep discernment, consideration, and intention from our national leadership. I am grateful for the hard work they are doing to help keep us all safe and well.

We at FUSIT are working diligently to ensure that we can continue to offer fantastic, engaging and inspiring programming for worship, religious exploration, and spiritual enrichment. We will continue to be essential even as we continue to offer programming online.

These next few months will bring many deicisions, changes, and shifts in the way we have built our expectations of what "being the church" looks like. We promise that this is all done with a great and deep hope that we can be together again as soon as possible. We also know that there is possiblity that this will change. That being said, your health and safety are paramount in our minds and hearts, and we need to plan accordingly.

You all have amazed me with your ability to care for yourselves and each other, even at a distance. Thank you for your diligence and care for your community. We love you.

#### All Souls Matter

In August 2018, I was honored and anxious when Reverend Margaret asked me to serve as the Acting Director of Religious Education for one year. We held a Visioning Retreat with Kim Sweeney in January 2019 and planned to conduct a search in the spring of 2019, but for many reasons that search never happened and I agreed to serve another year.

As I wrap up my second year in my role as your DRE, I thought this would be a good time to share a bit about what we've accomplished together and what religious education might look like for the foreseeable future.

We have accomplished so much together in the last two years. With the support of the RE Team and many dedicated volunteers, I focused on building relationships with our children, making the curriculum meaningful, and communicating consistently. Children registered in our program increased, average attendance increased, and volunteer participation increased. We offered important age-appropriate curriculum like Crossing Paths and Our Whole Lives. We formed partnerships with church-wide initiatives and experimented with a variety of ways to engage children during multigenerational services. We created systems, policies, and procedures that will serve our church community for years to come.

As much as I am proud of these accomplishments, I am most proud of the connections that have been made. We have welcomed children of all ages and encouraged them to come as they are. Children in our program have established important relationships with each other. Intergenerational relationships have been formed that are meaningful to our children and adults. And we have connected with our local community through a variety of important service projects.

I have learned so much in the last two years. There is one lesson that seems most pertinent at this moment: What we create together on Sundays can be magical, but the most important religious education that we do happens outside the walls of our church. It happens in our homes every day. There has never been a more important time to live and model our UU values for the young people in our lives.

This isn't easy work. Like many of you, I was not raised in a UU household. Finding this religion later in life means I have been learning about it alongside my children. I have read that we, as UUs, are not always good about talking to our children about why we choose to be UUs. It might be because we want our children to be able to find their own way or because we don't feel confident enough to have those conversations.

But our children need us to have those conversations. Even if they are messy. They need to know how our actions, behaviors, and decisions are shaped by our UU values and when they are not. My experience in small group ministry has best prepared me for those important conversations.

The Soul Matters small groups we have at FUSIT give participants space to listen to their deepest self, to hear their inner teacher, and to explore a monthly theme that focuses on a spiritual value that our UU faith honors. As we experience the themes through the spiritual practices we become more connected to life, others and ourselves. The experience will feed your soul and prepare you to support the religious journeys of the young people in your life.

# The Church is Really Important to Me!

One of the most surprising journeys this spring has been the generous, heartfelt response to our spring pledge campaign. Truly, members and friends have given with love and hope in this uncertain time. When a Stewardship Team member called to thank one of you, the reply was, "Well, of course I had to pledge. The church is really important to me!"

Some apologized that they were not able to pledge more. We understand. Who knows what the coming year will bring. But this much is sure: The First Unitarian Society of Ithaca will be here, ready, willing and able to connect, inspire and engage, thanks to you.

# More Important than Ever

In most years, annual pledges account for more than 70 percent of our church's income. But this year, with the news that there will be no Recycling Sale in August, your pledge for the coming year is more important than ever.

Our campaign is going well, but we are not there yet. As we go to press, we have 186 pledges totalling \$323,485. We are a little behind last year at this time, but still hope to reach last year's record total of 206 pledges totalling \$345,000. Ah, that would be magic.

#### We Need You!

Heartfelt thanks to our first responders who have already pledged. You are our lifeline.

If you have not pledged yet, there is still time! But we are getting close to a 2020-21 budget and the annual meeting, so do not delay. We can only plan to spend what income we will have. We need you.

Large or modest, all pledges are important. They add up quickly. If you have never pledged before, consider \$12.50 per month. A few pledges at that level, plus a few more at \$50 or \$100 or \$200 per month, and we will be sparking magic a plenty.



Possible Ponderings is an offering of ways you might consider engaging more deeply with the theme or reflecting on the ways the idea of Beauty shows up in your life.


**June 4-13:** When were you first healed by beauty?
