From Susanne Quagliata, Acting Director, Religious Exploration The Future of RE In Our Church

This is my final newsletter as your Acting Director of Religious Exploration. Serving in this role has been an honor, and I appreciate the support and positive encouragement our church community has provided me in the last two years. The next time you see me I will not be a staff member. I will be Susanne - a FUSIT member, a parent with two children in the church, and a UU trying to find my way in this beautiful and broken world. Like you, I will have religious education needs from our church.

The summer newsletter is usually a time to tell you about all of our exciting plans for the upcoming church year. However, as I write this column in June, there is great uncertainty about what church will look like in the year ahead.

Last month I shared one of the lessons I learned in the last year: What we create together on Sundays can be magical, but the most important religious education that we do happens outside the walls of our church. It happens in our homes every day.

Another important lesson I've come to realize is that no matter who serves this church as minister or DRE, the most important person in your spiritual journey is YOU. I once read that across denominations, ministers serve an average of seven years. The tenure for DREs is even shorter. The constant in our congregation is you. Our religious exploration program will be what you make it.

What will you make of it?

One of the many wonderful things about our church community is that we are open to suggestions. Sometimes it might seem like we have a "this is how we've always done things" attitude, but more often than not, if someone comes forward with a good idea and the energy to make it happen, our church is supportive.

Don't wait for the staff to present their grand vision of religious exploration. Share your needs and the needs of your family. Then get involved. A healthy RE program needs at least two things: time and talent. If you don't feel like you have a talent to share, then please share your time. If everyone shared their time and talents then we can all learn from each other.

Regardless if you are new to the congregation or if you have been a member for decades, there is a place for you in our RE program. If you are part of a young family, if your children now have children of their own, or if you were once a child yourself you will find volunteering in our RE program to be as soul enriching as it is an act of service.

Our Religious Education Team has helped carry us through a period of transition but needs new energy. Please step forward if you can attend a monthly meeting and have ideas about how our RE program can represent the interests and needs of the congregation.

As we explore ways to remain connected online, consider volunteering to lead an interactive activity on Zoom. If you love to read children's stories, volunteer to read a book on our Facebook Live storytime series. If you have ideas about how to live our UU values, don't keep them a secret.

Our RE program will be what you make it.


