# Message from the Minister

The start of a new congregational year is a time of excitement, hope, and possibility. This is true even as the Covid pandemic continues and many of the customs and rituals of reopening and gathering are not possible. We are excited to up the level of activity an engagement. We are hopeful for what we as a church might achieve within the community and beyond. We are open to possibilities that we do not expect and cannot even imagine.

Even with socially distanced in-person meetings and video meetings in lieu of meetings that would otherwise be in person and just happen on the street, I am beginning to meet and know members of the First Unitarian Society of Ithaca.

To help our knowing each other, I will tell you a bit more about me than you may already know.

I became a Unitarian Universalist and joined my first UU church in Boston in 1969, while still in college. After working in a hospital for several years, I resumed formal education, graduating from the Harvard Divinity School in 1977. My first congregation was in Burbank, California. Since then I have served in parish and community ministries in cities and suburbs in a half-dozen states on three coasts and at the national level. Since 2008 I have specialized in transitional (interim and developmental) ministries. Over the years I have taught as adjunct faculty at the undergraduate and graduate level. For two decades, one of my homes away from home has been the YMCA in Newark, New Jersey.

I love people and the spontaneous interactions possible in many settings. The necessity of social distancing limits the spontaneity of human contact. But this is how we must live in the world, so that we can move through the pandemic. We will do this together. We have already begun the work of the interim period. We are working together during the 2021-2022 church year as you prepare to call your next settled minister and we learn together how to live spontaneously and fully in the time of pandemic.

We are already making the most of this year!



The FUSIT Antiracism Ministry Team continues its activities in the name of racial awareness and justice. The Team is just launching for the new church year, and welcomes new members.

There will be another opportunity to participate in the "Living the Pledge to End Racism" workshop this September and October. ### Update from the FUSIT Board of Trustees

The FUSIT Board of Trustees will be providing a brief "Sense of the Board Meeting" report and sharing it through the weekly newsletter the week after a Board of Trustees meeting. The full meeting minutes will continue to be made available, but this brief meeting summary is intended to keep the congregation tuned in to the activities and priorities of the Board.

Here is the "Sense of the Meeting" from the August 18 meeting, held both in-person and via Zoom from 6:31-8:08pm.

**Sundae Sunday:** Angela Zhang reported on behalf of the Transition Team that interest in meeting Rev. Tony Johnson is high, and an event for that purpose would be a good idea. Emily Richards reported on behalf of the staff that we are close to having the smaller Stewart Park pavilion reserved for Sunday, **September 12**. An in-person gathering there can double as our traditional Sundae Sunday ice cream special and an introduction to Rev. Tony.

**Gathering Policy Update:** The Way Forward Team has updated the FUSIT policy for in-person gatherings in light of new developments in the Covid-19 situation, and reported these changes to the Board.

**Ministerial Transition, 1:** Rev. Tony gave a brief introduction and is looking forward to working with the worship team, tech team, and musicians to launch Sunday services in September.

**Ministerial Transition, 2:** The Board appointed a Transition Team consisting of Therese O'Connor, Elton Hall, Angela Zhang, Jessica Brown, Fred Balfour, and Marie Benedetti. Thank you to all for your time and care!

**Governance Work:** The Board passed motions to:

- I Create a Governance Committee
- 2 Create a Personnel Committee
- 3 Establish a clear policy for executive sessions of the Board
- 4 Approve the use of a Board-only Slack channel for intra-Board communications

**Sexton:** We urgently need a sexton in order to reopen for in-person gatherings. The Board has therefore resolved to coalesce the three budget items 'sexton', 'cleaning', and 'snow removal' into one line item: 'sexton', with a total amount of \$21,000, but allowing a total cost of up to \$26,000. Additionally, if it proves necessary, the Board preapproves a return to contracting out the cleaning and snow removal services, but with the increased financial cap, to give Rev. Tony and staff the greatest flexibility in resolving this need.

The next Board meeting will take place on **September 15**, **2021**, from 6:30-8:00pm. It will be a hybrid meeting held both in-person and via Zoom.

The Care Team continues its work to provide support to our congregation as we move into our second fall dealing with COVID. Kathy Hopkins at 607-592-3025 coordinates finding rides for those who need transportation to appointments.

- —We need someone to coordinate meals or groceries when a congregant needs some short term help.
- —If you have a few minutes a week to make a call to members who are alone and isolated during COVID, please contact Madonna or Michelle.
- —Lastly we need a person who has a wide knowledge of our members and of local medical and mental health resources as a back up and consult for Madonna.

I want to thank Rev. Margaret for her consistent availability for Pastoral Care while she was with us. We will do our best to support Rev. Tony in taking over that part of his job.
