Our Spiritual Journey

"If – like me – you're attachment rich, if you are included in most or many circles, if you belong in almost any place you find yourself, we have the opportunity and responsibility to include the unincluded... Look for someone who appears not to belong today and choose them." -Jan Edmiston

My oldest child struggles a lot with feeling excluded. My youngest child does not. Not that she doesn't feel that way on occasion but it's not the norm for her the way it is for my oldest.

I have had the opportunity to watch the way that they interact with their peers and it is easy to see how the differences in their personalities affect their lived experience.

My youngest doesn't need to be invited to join in with whatever is going on. She seems to easily fit herself into any group of children, often leading games and inviting others to join.

On the other hand my oldest needs an explicit invitation. She flits around the edges, waiting to be asked to be a part of whatever conversation or game is happening. And when she has complained to me about nobody wanting to play with her I have often responded that she needs to just go join in. But it's not really that easy for most of us, is it?

At one of the religious educator conferences that I attended I remember commenting to someone that I found mealtimes awkward because I didn't really know anyone and those were the times we were on our own with no programming. And they responded that I should just go ask someone to join them for dinner. And suddenly I was on the other side of the response that I so often gave to my child. And it felt dismissive. As if walking up to a group of strangers and asking to join them should be easy and simple. But it's not.

It can be easy to exclude people unintentionally. All it takes is not noticing those who are flitting around the edges, waiting for that invitation to be included. To be asked to be a part of something.

So, this month I invite you to consider what it really means to live love through the practice of inclusion. Look for someone who appears not to belong, and choose them.

This month we are Living Love Through the Practice of Inclusion.

February, as we all know, is Black History Month. And while Black History Month offers us an opportunity to honor the important voices and contributions of black Americans, our faith calls us to lift up the reality of racial oppression all the time, and to constantly examine and re-examine how we are living our values of justice and equity every day.

Living Love through Inclusion is, at its core, about noticing and feeling the pain that comes from being left out and unseen. As we explore the concept of inclusion together I hope that you are able to reconnect with memories of the many people in your life who included you and helped you feel fully seen.

Inclusion is more than just welcome, it's about creating a true place of belonging. About breaking down the barriers that we create, often without even realizing it, that keep people out. It's about putting love at the center, for everyone.




