Beloveds, we begin this new church year in a time of uncertainty. These are not easy days. Perhaps, like me, you feel like we are being asked to believe in love when love itself is under attack. To believe in belonging when all we are being shown is a people divided.

And yet, believing in belonging means believing in love. It means choosing one another again and again, even when it's hard. Even when the world is telling us that it's safer to turn away, to divide, to close in. In these times the very act of opening ourselves up to others, to welcoming people in, can feel like an act of moral courage.

Rev. Rali Weaver tells us that "belonging is not a place, but a promise". We don't arrive at belonging, we offer it to one another. Love is at the center of this faith, a liberating love. A love that reminds us that we offer belonging when we show up, when we listen, when we make space, and when we live out our values. Bell hooks wrote "Love is an action, never simply a feeling." Now, more than at any other time, we are being called on to act. To welcome in the stranger. To provide shelter from the storm.

And if that love, that sense of belonging, feels hard to hold onto right now, that's okay. Let us hold it for you. Let us hold you. That's part of what belonging means, too.

May this community be a sanctuary, a place of both safety and courage. And may we, together, keep returning to this truth: Love is not gone. It's just waiting for us to live it.

Here you are welcome. Here you belong.

#### **Greetings from the Director of Religious Exploration**

Welcome to a new year of Religious Exploration (RE). We are kicking it off with the theme "belonging". In the simplest terms belonging is to be a part of something. If you're reading this you are already a part of our community at the First Unitarian Society of Ithaca. I do not believe that "being a part of something" can fully describe how we feel within this community. When we feel safe and supported we begin to feel like we belong. This feeling of safety and security comes from authentic inclusion. This month I encourage you to brainstorm ways that this community has made you feel included. Let us take what we have learned and put it into practice so one day we all may feel like we belong.

We are thrilled to continue to offer Religious Exploration programming three Sundays a month, with two Classroom Sundays, and one mixed ages Creative Sunday. On Sundays that do not have RE programming, we hold an interactive multigenerational service in the sanctuary. This year we are expanding from 3, to five classrooms. This will help us continue to meet the needs of our children and youth by offering lessons and activities that are more precisely geared toward each age group.

Our elementary classrooms explore monthly themes, through stories, activities, crafts, and games. The Middle School youth group will have an exciting opportunity to visit neighboring faiths through the "Crossing Paths" curriculum. Lastly, our Highschool youth will use what they have learned through their RE experience to explore and share spiritual practices that resonate with them using an approach similar to small group ministry.

The nursery is open every Sunday from 10 am-12 pm.



#### Message from the Board of Trustees

Greetings Beloved Community. This summer in a competitive race, I narrowly won the coveted seat of Board President. (Be advised, this entry is laced with sarcasm). While in truth this isn't a position many people seek, nor was I seeking it, I am proud to be able to fill this need, and I'm grateful to Fred Balfour for paving the way these last two years.

I thought I would take this opportunity to introduce myself. I've been a UU for four years but consider myself a lifetime pluralist, spiritualist, and social justice seeker (with Southern Baptist redneck roots). My partner, Ben, and I have two awesome kids - Stonie (5) and Ren (2) and a few too many pets. I'm a clinical psychologist specializing in childhood trauma and school behavioral health. I like skiing, hiking, sweet tea, and wine. I think I'm funny although most people, particularly my family, do not agree.

I also think a lot about Relational Health. Relational health is an all-encompassing term to describe what it means to develop and maintain meaningful relationships. As you all probably know, meaningful relationships aren't easy, and being in true connection to others means tolerating distress, forgiving, letting go, speaking up, being vulnerable, being humble, and trying again, over and over. With that said, I want you to know a few things as we enter into a relationship with one another:

This is a congregation of humans, and I like interacting and communicating in a way that honors our shared humanity. I hope our Society is a place where you feel enough trust to be your genuine self and acknowledge the humanity in others. If it's not, let's work on that together.

I have a few strengths but far more weaknesses. I'm probably going to mess up at some point. But I promise, if I do, I'll own it and try to fix it. If I offend you, please tell me. I'm not here to be right, but to get it right, and I think repairing relationships is one of the most important human things we can do. Sometimes I take on too much and miss things, and I rely on people around me to keep me accountable.

There is so much to celebrate within this congregation, and there are also relational hurts and pains. Some are fresh wounds and some are old but remain unhealed. Please tell me about those, and let's work on healing together. In general, I hope you all speak up, especially those of you who are often quiet, in a way that honors our Covenant and can better our relational health. I keep secrets for a living, and I'm not easily scared off. I'm always willing to talk individually.

And finally! Most of us in leadership at FUSIT, including myself, don't have enough time to do what's required. We welcome your leadership on our team so we can enjoy a fulfilling year where all hands are involved and no one person burns out. (And if you're thinking to yourself that you're not leadership material, think again! We welcome thinkers, feelers, and doers, those with spare time and those with none).

#### **FUSIT Finances**

As the church's Treasurer, I have created a mission for myself to improve readers awareness of the church's finances. This will be a long series, but I hope you'll stay with me. I'll try to make this in bite size chunks. I encourage you to write to me with your questions and suggestions because that is how I know I am accomplishing my mission. Email: sunnybrk@gmail.com

The first point that I want to make is that while finances are necessary for living in the capitalist economy, finances are not our mission and vision. You won't find finances mentioned in the UU Principles and now Values. I'm not sure if that's the reason we don't talk about money at FUSIT. So, I want us to be conscious that money is important to accomplishing our mission but its just a tool, an important tool, but it's not the end of our work.

The adopted budget for this fiscal year is within a few thousand dollars of one half million (\$492,250). I will be spending time in the coming weeks putting that into perspective both in terms of how we allocate funds and comparison to overarching UUA data.

Our fiscal year does not match our calendar year nor how we think about our own family budgets. The church's fiscal year starts July 1 and ends June 30th. So, we're just starting the 2025-2026 fiscal year. In the future, I'll shorten this to 25-26.

My name is Laura Ramos, and I'm honored to be joining you as your new Music Coordinator!

I hold a B.M. in Music Education from Syracuse
University and an M.Ed. in Curriculum and Teaching from
Fitchburg State University. For the past eight years, I've taught
music and directed choirs in Massachusetts, while also serving
